4. SPSA:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>No agenda Items</li> </ul>	Olivero explained that the school submits an SPSA every year and then in Spring the SSC must evaluate the plan and the money spent. SSC evaluates how we utilized money and the purpose of those expenses. We did shift funds so not all the planned purposes are the same as in the original SPSA. Part of the process is to look at data. Olivero shared and posted a series of data reports (see attachments). 1. Grade comparison of the number of Ds and Fs. Last year this time, student grades could not be lowered so not worth comparing. Olivero compared Q 1 2020 to Q3. Generally grades are down. Boerner asked if there is any

feedback from other principals. Olivero answered that yes most schools are experiencing about 40-50% whole grade loss and have to retake. UC is not that high and more at about 15%. This will impact the master schedule. 2. FAST data. This data compares reading levels of students from the Fall to the Spring. This assessment will replace the ELA SBA this spring as the standardized test. 3. ELPAC data shows English learners proficiency in English Language. Many incoming students were not able to complete the exam before COVID. As a result only six students were reclassified as compared to approximately 20 each year. 4. Mending Matters This is the mental health extra counseling UC pays for. Hall asked if we have any math data or Power up data. Olivero responded that only the grades. Power Up with break out rooms is not how it is designed.

There are two plans that need to be evaluated; the LCFF and the Title I (see attached). Each plan going through the goals, how the money was spent and for what purpose. Olivero went through each goal and asked SSC to discussed what we would change for next year and modify. Due to distant learning, it is difficult to evaluate the effectiveness because class was not held as intended. For goal #1 UC added the equity team. Goal #2 ELA teachers had ZOOM training and GVC training. The new 9<sup>th</sup> grade English class was added with ethnic studies emphasis. UC purchased books to supplement the course. Gonzalez was paid for technology support. The recommendation is to stay with the same plan next year since we don't know what modifications to make based on the COVID circumstances. Goal 3 is math. UC will keep Power up, IT support and teacher training. Goal 7 is Family engagement. One benefit to COVID has been ZOOM meetings for parents. More parent engagement has been seen and UC will continue to hold online meetings next year. Goal 8 is graduation, no modifications.

The second plan is the Title I plan. ELA professional development for teachers, 9<sup>th</sup> grade curriculum, ZOOM training, all same as LCFF. For Math you see the \$4000 for Power UP. UC added the ALD classes for English Learners to support. Again it is difficult to measure effectiveness due to the other factors involved in distant learning. The Equity team PD was repurposed from visiting teachers funds. Olivero asked for any questions. Boener added that we have been through this information many time when doing budget transfers so it is clear. Grades is the main data to look at and they are all over the place due to the students' online experiences.

Olivero reported on school site; fewer students on site than when we started. It has been difficult for all to navigate both ZOOM and in person.
