Point Loma keeps campus open in the AM and some time after lunch. This will take time and will need discussions with the city. Would possibly need a gate that would delineate the front and back parking lot and a fence behind the marquis and cattle gate, and raising the gate along Genesse. One of the long standing points of concern is that the Robins gate is open all the time to offer passage onto our campus. Talks with the city about why we may need to get rid of this.
